### Academic Achievements 2022



### 2022 VCE Highlights

- In 2022, eleven students scored an ATAR above 95 (three more than last year)
- College Dux is Kevin Shah (99.70)
- Matthew Power (99.0) and Thomas Alisandratos (98.35) rounded out our top three achieving VCE students
- Twenty-four students (12.1%) scored an ATAR above 90
- 31% of students scored an ATAR in the top 20% of the entire state
- 52% of students scored an ATAR above 70
- 71% of students scored an ATAR above 60
- 89% of students scored an ATAR above 50; an increase from last year

Please don't hesitate to ask for help or support whenever you need - Tutor Teachers, House Leaders, Student Wellbeing Coordinators, Deans of Students, Counsellors, and Classroom Teachers - all of our staff are on hand to assist you with a smooth transition to the College.

There are so many things to discover and try at Parade and we hope you find your interests and passions and follow them during your journey with us. This will help to make your secondary school experience your own. The best advice we can give our newest members is to take advantage of all opportunities you are offered as this will help with the transition, making new friends and connecting you to the College on many different levels.

### Year 7 2023 Families

It was wonderful to see our newest Paradians at the Orientation Sessions for the 2023 Year 7s in December last year. Tutor Teachers and House Leaders had a great time getting to know the young men and enjoyed their company. We hope our Year 7s first day on Wednesday 1 February is equally as exciting and reassuring for them.

We know transition to a new school can be a time of great trepidation for students and their families so here are some important upcoming events and dates for the beginning of the 2023 year.

Please remember we are all here to help and your child's Tutor Teacher and House Leader are a wealth of information should you have any concerns or questions.

### Year 7 First Day

**Wednesday 1 February 8.35am to 3.15pm**

*The Year 7s will meet Wednesday 1 February at 8.35am in Moore Hall. Parents, please drop your sons and they will be met by a member of staff who will guide them to Moore Hall.*

- On the first day all Year 7s will need to bring their College Student Planner, laptop, and padlock for their locker.
- Students will need to wear their Summer College Uniform.
- School shoes are required to be made of hard, black, polishable leather – these provide greater protection than 'sports' style shoes.
- Students will need to bring their recess/snacks and lunch. or alternatively the Canteen will be open for students to purchase lunch.

### Failte Liturgy 2023

**Wednesday 1 February 12.00pm to 12.50pm**

*On the first day we have the Failte liturgy where we recognise Year 7 and Year 12 mentors. This Liturgy welcomes our newest Paradians, recognises their work with their Year 12 mentor, and begins the process of handing on the traditions of our College.*

Year 7 parents are very welcome to join the boys and staff for this in Moore Hall at Bundoora. Please arrive early to ensure we can begin on time. The Liturgy will begin at noon and conclude around 12.50pm. All Year 7s will then remain on campus for periods 5 and 6 before finishing the school day at 3.15pm.

### **Uniform**

*At Parade, we value the tradition of wearing the College uniform well to honour all those men who have worn the purple, green and blue with pride and respect over the last 150 years*

In 2023 Parade will continue with the College's published Uniform Policy which includes only wearing the PE uniform on the day when the year level has ACC sport. Every other day will be the summer or winter uniform depending on the term. Term 1 is summer uniform. If a student has PE they will bring their PE uniform and change at the beginning of the lesson.

Please check that your son has the correct College Summer shirt ready to go for Day 1. Winter shirts with or without a tie are not permitted. College Summer shirts will only be worn for Terms 1 and 4.

- Grey shorts or trousers can be worn in Term 1 – dress shorts only – no elastic or drawstring waists.
- Jumpers and blazers go together to and from school. If your son wishes to wear his jumper to and from school, he must wear his blazer as well.
- Grey marle walk socks with black, hard, polishable leather shoes – no canvas shoes, or black leather 'sports-style' shoes. No black socks.

- Leave all jewellery at home – no earrings, pierced jewellery (including clear plastic studs), necklaces, rings, bracelets, friendship bands, sports bands, or other bands to be worn. If it is precious or important in any way to your son, it is safer at home, away from possible accidental damage or loss.
- Hair should be neat, clean and in a business-like style, eg; no dreadlocks, braids, mohawks, 'Dusty-cuts', etc.
- If your son is shaving, please make sure that he is clean-shaven for school each day.

Please Note: All students in Years 7 to 12 at both campuses must wear their College uniform to school on Thursday 9 February (Preston) and Friday 10 February (Bundoora) for College photos and bring their blazers and ties with them.

VCE Vocational Major and VCE students should wear the grey Senior Tie for these photos which can be purchased from Academy Uniforms. There is a minimal number of ties available to purchase from Reception at both Campuses.

### **PE Uniform**

Students can choose whether to wear their tracksuits to school with their polo shirts and shorts on their designated ACC Sport day in each term. As we phase in the new tracksuits, both tracksuit styles will be acceptable PE wear. Students can wear white or black socks.

If your son does not have a full PE Uniform to wear to school on his designated ACC Sport Day, he must wear the College Uniform to school and bring whatever items of PE Uniform he has with him in his bag to school and change for class. He should change back into his College Uniform after his PE lesson in time for the rest of his classes and travelling home in the afternoon.

PE Uniform comprises the Parade polo, Parade shorts, white or black socks and runners. If any one of these items is missing, or unavailable on his designated PE Uniform Day - even if it is only white/black socks - then your son must wear his College Uniform that day.

Your son can choose to wear his full tracksuit or track jacket or track pants with these basic items.

### **All Day Absence, Early Departure, or Late Arrival**

All day absences must be recorded on PAM (Parent Access Module) each morning students are away. If no reason is given parents will be sent a text message around 11.00am reminding them to log into PAM to record the reason for their son's absence.

Late arrivals and early departures must be recorded by families through PAM. There will be no absence phone line and students signing in late or out early will need to have had this recorded on PAM in advance. This will ensure our records are accurate.

We communicated last year a number of times about the process for all day absences. If your son is leaving early or arriving late it must be recorded on PAM. This can be found in the same place all day absences are recorded.

### **Daily Messages**

Once you click on the above icon you will click early departure or late arrival (rather than all day absence) and this will automatically alert your child's teacher and Student Services. There is no need to provide a handwritten note.

Your son will simply head to Student Services to officially sign out.

### **College Bus Network**

*At Parade, we value respect for, and cooperation with, those whose job it is to get us safely to and from school each day*

- Students are not allowed to eat or drink on any of the buses to and from school - this is to assist the bus drivers to get to their next job on time, with a clean vehicle, or to help them complete their shifts on time at the end of the day, as well as ensuring a clean environment for all bus users;
- All young men are required to stay in their seats to and from school and wear seat belts where these are provided as part of the student's responsibility for ensuring a safe trip for other passengers and the bus driver.
- Throwing any kind of material inside or outside the bus is a serious offence and will be treated as such. It is particularly distracting to bus drivers on very busy roads as well as disrespectful to the driver and fellow students.
- Noise levels should be kept to a reasonable level to allow bus drivers to concentrate on the task of getting students safely to their destinations.
- A MYKI card with appropriate funds is required for those students travelling on buses where a MYKI fare is required.
- Finally, cooperation with any directions given by bus drivers in the interests of passenger safety is always required from Parade students.

## Public Transport

We expect all students to behave with courtesy and respect towards drivers and other passengers when using any form of public transport to and from school, and on excursions.

We also expect students to stand and offer their seats to members of the public when using any form of public transport.

## Plenty Road and Bell Street

For students' safety, we require all students who need to cross Plenty Road or Bell Street, for any reason, to do so at the lights on the marked pedestrian crossings.

The traffic lights at the entrance to the Bundoora Campus do not mark a pedestrian crossing and students should not attempt to cross Plenty Road at that point.

***Bundoora Parents, please do not ask your son to meet you in the Hungry Jack's car park, or drop him off there in the morning – the boys will always take the shortest way across the road, and there is no designated crossing from that point across Plenty Road.***

We would ask that parents emphasise this point with their sons so that students can remain safe as they cross two very busy roadways.

Unfortunately, four years ago, one of our students was involved in an accident with a car, as he was not using a designated crossing. Fortunately, he recovered from that incident, but it is a reminder of how dangerous our roads can be.

We also expect students to obey traffic signals, teacher directions and instructions given by Parade staff and Council Crossing Supervisors.

## From the Development Office

### Academy Uniforms

All students are expected to commence the 2023 school year in the correct College uniform which can be purchased online from Academy Uniforms or, in person at their store at 238 Wolseley Place, Thomastown.

### College Photographs

All students are required to have their photograph taken as it is used for school Identification, applied to school ID cards, transport concession cards, and published in the 2023 College Yearbook. It is also your important keepsake.

As such, each student must participate, regardless of whether you wish to purchase photos.



## What if I missed ordering before Photo Day?

You can still place your order online OR you can call us on (03) 9428 9420 and our friendly staff can help you complete your order over the phone. We recommend that all orders are placed before photo day to ensure your child's order is included in the bulk delivery to the school.

## What if my child is wearing a face mask?

Covid-19 is still a very real concern for a lot of people and National Photography are conscious of ensuring that everyone feels safe while having their photos taken. Subjects may wear their mask up until the photo is being taken at which point, we will request that they remove their face mask. If the subject does not wish to remove their face mask at any point, the photographer will not enforce this and will take their photograph with their face mask on.

## Why does my child have to take their glasses off for photos?

Due to the aspects of studio lighting, we will sometimes get light reflecting in a subject's glasses. Our Photographers work hard to ensure reflections are not visible in the image but this isn't always possible. Where reflections are visible these will be removed in post-production. To assist our post-production team, it is helpful to have a photo of the subject without their glasses. The photographer will explain this to any affected subjects on the day and request that they remove their glasses for a photo. If the subject is uncomfortable removing their glasses they will not be forced to.

## Do the photographer's notice if my child's hair is out of place?

We have mirrors and combs on hand for all students to access before their photo time. Photographer's are trained to pick up on things such as hair falling in front of eyes and depending on the school's photo requirements we will advise student's on how to present for the photo. We are advised by the client of certain requirements for their students ahead of photo day that can include hair, piercings and uniform requirements. We are very respectful when speaking with students and will never force them to do anything that makes them feel uncomfortable.

## From the Dean of Learning - Years 7 to 9

### Year 7 to 9 Semester 1 Timetables

Student timetables are built around maximising students' elective choices.

## From the First Aid Office

Please ensure student medical information is entered online via the parent portal to assist us in providing the most appropriate care.

Parents must let the College know immediately if your son develops chicken pox/varicella, shingles or measles. Other students may be receiving medical treatment which increases the risk of complications from these infectious illnesses

Students sometimes suffer from illness or injury during the school day. Parents will be contacted when necessary and may be asked to collect students from school. We do not have the capacity to care for students throughout the day when they are not fit to participate in their usual school activities.

Exceptions to this include students who are undergoing rehabilitation and transitioning back to school after absence, and students managing chronic illnesses

Parents, please keep your contact phone numbers up to date, including at least a third contact person for times when you are unavailable.

### Anaphylaxis - Epipens and Excursions

Parents of students that are at risk of Anaphylaxis should be aware that, in response to Ministerial Order 706, it is College policy and a requirement of legislation that students who attend the College must have supplied the College with a valid Epipen and a current Anaphylaxis Action Plan for their personal use.

In order for a student to attend an excursion or event off the premises they must carry their individual College Epipen and their spare Epipen from home with them in order to attend that event. This is to ensure that sufficient medications are available should the student require them.

***Parents/carers are required to update their son's expired Epipen and Anaphylaxis Action Plan as soon as possible. Epipens and Action Plans need to be dropped at College Reception at both campuses.***

### Asthma

It is usual for students who have asthma to carry their own reliever medication such as Ventolin in their pockets, however the College is able to supply Ventolin to a student who does not have their asthma medication and spacer on hand.

The administration of Ventolin is done after consulting your son's Asthma Action Plan from PAM. If your son does not have an Asthma Action Plan and the situation is not deemed an emergency, the College will ring the parent/carer to have permission granted to administer the medication.

In the event of an asthma medical emergency and you have not supplied a current Action Plan, the First Aid Officer would follow emergency asthma care guidelines and an ambulance called.

### Asthma Action Plans

It is important that the College has the latest medical information for your son.

Unfortunately, there are a number of parents and carers who have not supplied a current Asthma Action Plan to their son's medical profile.

Parents/carers of students with asthma are requested that they check their son's medical profile and ensure that they have supplied a current Asthma Action Plan signed by a Doctor to the College and have uploaded this plan to their son's medical profile on PAM. This will allow our First Aid Officers the ability to act quickly with the appropriate guidance to assist your son.

## Medication

The College does not provide medication (including Paracetamol, Aspirin, Ibuprofen, etc). Students who require medication during the day (headaches, pain relief) must provide their own supplies, which may be stored in the First Aid Room, to be accessed as required.

College Staff will not administer such medication. Supervision will be provided. It is the students' responsibility to administer their own medication. Parents will also be required to complete a Medication Authority Form available from the First Aid Office.

Students with other significant health issues are requested that their Management Plans for their condition are dropped off at Reception, which will be forwarded to the First Aid Officer.



### Morning Student Drop off Zones

The College has two convenient zones for students to be dropped off at the Bundoora Campus: Garvey Terrace and ERC carpark.

#### Garvey Terrace

Vehicles entering the main driveway from Plenty Rd may drop students at Garvey Terrace. Drop off only, no standing zone.

#### ERC Carpark

Vehicles entering via Milton Parade may drop off students at the ERC carpark between 7.00am and 9.00am. Please refer to the map on page 24 and 25.

### Afternoon Student Pick up Zones

The College has two convenient zones where vehicles may park, to collect students at the end of the school day from the Bundoora Campus: Garvey Terrace II and ERC carparks.

#### Garvey Terrace II

Vehicles entering the main driveway from Plenty Rd may park in the Garvey Terrace II and Garvey Oval carparks.

Vehicles may exit left via Garvey Oval exit, prior to 3.30pm. Vehicles may only exit through the Visitor's carpark and main drive once all buses have departed, at 3.30pm.

#### ERC Carpark

Enter via Milton Parade. Carpark open from 3.00pm to 3.35pm

The Bundoora main driveway will be staffed at the beginning of the school year to assist you.

### Bus Bays

Please take note of your afternoon bus pick-up point. The following buses will be parked on the main bus circuit:

**A B C D E F G H J1&2 K L M N**

The following buses will be parked in Garvey Terrace:

**A2 PCF P Q R T**

The following buses will enter and pick-up in the bus circuit once all other buses depart.

**B2** from bay B  
**W** from bay D  
**Y** from bay E  
**X1&2** from bay F

### Bus Information

- Please check the latest routes and timetables prior to beginning of the school year, some have changed.
- Parade buses use public bus stops along all bus routes
- Be at your bus stop and visible to bus driver, 10 mins prior to the timetabled time.
- Do not wait inside a car, this makes it difficult for bus drivers to identify students

### 2023 Bus Services

If you were on a College Charter or PTV bus in 2022, and you wish to remain on the same bus in 2023, you do not need to reapply. The 2022 Bus Pass is valid in 2023 until new Student ID cards are issued during Term 1.

Students who have applied for a 2023 bus service, including 2023 enrolments, will receive a letter in January confirming their bus route/routes. This letter may be used to catch buses during the first week of school. Bus Passes will be handed out by Tutor Teachers at commencement of on-site classes.

### MYKI

Students using any PTV service including College PTV buses must carry and be able to present an in-credit MYKI card. Students are required to tap on at the beginning of each journey and tap off when alighting the bus at their destination.





## Parade College Aboriginal Ties and Scarves

We are very proud to be able to offer the sale of the College Aboriginal Ties and Scarves to our College community.

Designed by Aboriginal Parade students in 2019 and approved with consultation by Wurundjeri Elder Auntie Di Kerr, they tell the Aboriginal story of the Parade College grounds, as told by Wurundjeri Elder Uncle Dave Wandin.


The circles represent the people who lived, cared for, farmed, hunted and travelled on this Country. Aboriginal people lived and met on this Country daily to hunt and sit under the big Red Gums they planted. They exchanged information about land management, what they saw on their daily walks, observed, ate and shared food, weaved and traded.

You can see the kangaroo tracks down the tie, representing the Kangaroos that lived on this land to feed and rest. The Aboriginal meaning of Bundoora is thought to mean where the kangaroos lived.
