From the Principal

Welcome Back

As we commence Term 4 this week, I hope the break has allowed for some family time and relaxation. I am mindful of the dedicated work of the senior students who have taken advantage of opportunity for revision over the past two weeks in preparation for their upcoming exams. Well done to all involved and thank you to the staff for supporting students during their break.

Learning and Teaching Arrangements

I am pleased to provide you with some clarity regarding the way forward for your son/s at Parade College this term after the announcements made recently by the Premier and Education Minister.

It is reassuring to see a roadmap out of lockdown and a hopefulness emerging. Certainly, the commencement of daylight saving over the last weekend assists in lifting our spirit as well!

The following is a summary to assist you in navigating the return to onsite learning for all students. We will continue to provide you with updates throughout the coming weeks once received from the Victorian Government. Our aim is to continue to offer the highest level of teaching and learning, whilst holding the safety and mental health and wellbeing of all members of the Parade College community at the centre:

Tuesday 5 October to Monday 25 October

- Year 7 to Year 11 and VCAL Final Year continue online remote learning
- From Wednesday 6 October, Year 12 classes (VCAL Final Year and VCE 3/4 Units) will be delivered onsite
- Year 11 students completing a Unit 4 subject will attend the College for these classes. Where Year 11 students are unable to return home to access their Unit 2 classes in time, these students will access the online remote learning program onsite. It is expected however, that the Year 11 students do return home at their earliest convenience.
- Students living in regional Victoria and attending Parade College will be able to attend onsite learning with their Year level. **Final year students in this situation, however, must be double vaccinated or undertake twice weekly COVID-19 PCR testing.**

From Tuesday 26 October

Subject to Victorian Government and current DHHS advice and appropriate safety measures being in place:

- Year 7 and Year 11 students will return every day to full-time onsite learning
- Years 8 and 9 will return for onsite classes on Tuesdays and Wednesdays only, with online home learning in place for all other days
- Years 10 will return for onsite classes on Thursdays and Fridays only, with online home learning in place for all other days

From Friday 5 November

Subject to Victorian Government and current DHHS advice and appropriate safety measures being in place:

- All Year 7 to 11 students return to full-time onsite learning

Students Living in Regional Victoria

Students living in regional Victoria and attending Parade College will be able to attend onsite learning with their Year level.

Staff and Final Year students in this situation, however, must be double vaccinated or undertake twice weekly COVID-19 PCR testing to help keep our schools safe.

In addition to the importance of having the boys back in classes on site, we will continue to monitor their wellbeing and are conscious of the extended periods of time that they have been at home. We have been looking at various ways to prioritise their wellbeing and connection with their peers during Term 4 and into 2022.

Vaccinations

Staff

The Victorian Government has announced mandatory vaccinations for all school staff. The mandate applies to all staff, teachers, support staff, administrative staff and cleaners.

All staff are required to have had a first Vaccination dose by 18 October or have a booking within one week of that date, with FULL vaccination required by 29 November unless a medical exemption applies

Students

As part of the COVID-19 vaccination rollout, please note that the following advice has been provided by the Victorian Government:

All Victorians aged 12 and older are eligible to book and receive a COVID-19 vaccine at a state vaccination centre, a Commonwealth vaccination centre, or through a GP clinic, pharmacy or community health service

Vaccination bookings for students should be made by following the instructions on the Coronavirus Victoria website

Vaccination for students is not mandatory, but it is strongly encouraged

COVID-19 Safety Practices

As onsite schooling resumes, we will continue to have in place strong measures to protect the health and safety of students, staff, families and the community. This includes:

- Maintaining our COVID Safe Plan
- Maintaining QR codes and a register of those onsite on particular days
- Continuing to emphasise hand hygiene
- Regular cleaning to occur daily
- The wearing of face masks by all with consistent protocols established for all students
- Managing density limits and supporting physical distancing where possible
- Monitoring notifications of potential COVID-19 exposure
- The Leadership Team continue to meet regularly and review relevant literature daily
- If your son develops any Coronavirus symptoms, please get him tested at a COVID-19 testing facility, stay home and communicate with the College of your actions

During the lockdown, our building contractor, Striking Constructions, has been able to finalise work on a Pavilion adjacent to the Ambrose Treacy Oval at the Preston Campus. The buildings include a covered viewing area, change rooms, showers and amenities.

I am proud to announce that the College's Advisory Council and the Edmund Rice Education Australia Board have approved naming the Pavilion after John Nicholls as a tribute to his 43+ years of service and the central role John has played in developing our highly regarded VCAL Program and Pathways.



We look forward to officially opening the facility later in the year in the presence of John's family.

Plenary Council

Over three years ago the decision was announced to hold a Plenary Council and people have been preparing for this historic moment by listening to God and by listening to one another's stories of faith.

After this time of listening and journeying the Catholic Church of Australia will gather for the first assembly of the Plenary Council from 3 to 10 October 2021.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic the First Assembly will be held via 'one device-one person' mode. There will be seventeen members participating in this gathering who have been called from the Archdiocese of Melbourne.

From the Assistant Principal - Teaching & Learning

Term 4 Teaching and Learning

As we welcome our students back along a staggered return to onsite learning, teachers are conscious of students' fatigue with online learning and their level of motivation at this stage of the year. They will be working hard to provide rich and engaging learning experiences throughout Term 4. Students' cameras are expected to be on in MS Teams lessons, with microphones muted.

I would like to remind our families of important events relevant to your son's learning.

VCAA VCE and VET Unit 3/4 Performance and Written Examinations

The first exam for most students is English on Wednesday 27 October, although language oral and music performance examinations can commence from as early as next week. Minor language exams also precede the written examination period. All those involved should carefully check their timetables, received recently in Tutor Group, and the Exam Navigator.

It is very important that if your son is sitting external VCE/VET Exams, he makes the most of this preparation time. These first few weeks of Term 4 consist of formal revision classes (6 to 15 October in line with the last days program) followed by informal revision (18 October until the scheduled exam dates) with Year 12 teachers available during regular timetabled class times up to the date of respective exams.

Accelerating Year 11 students will continue to attend classes until the date of the respective VCAA examinations.

These revision events provide an excellent opportunity for our final year students to finish the year on a high and make the most of their final preparations for the VCAA Unit 3/4 written examinations.

Year 11 Semester 2 Exams

Year 11 exams are an important experience in preparation for Year 12. The exams will now take place from 10 to 18

November, moved a week later than initially scheduled due to the necessary cancellation of the Year 12 Commencement Camp at Philip Island. Over the exam period, students are only required to attend school to sit their Unit 2 examinations. Your sons will receive extensive revision materials to assist in their preparations for these exams but should ensure that they have started the term with good study habits.

Year 8, 9 and 10 Semester 2 Exams

Due to the extended period of remote learning, exams for Years 8 to 10 will not be conducted during Term 4. Semester exams may be replaced by more appropriate alternative assessments that will focus on Semester 2 coursework and particularly on that taught when students return face-to-face.

NAPLAN Online School Readiness Test


We are awaiting confirmation from the VCAA for a new date for the School Readiness Test (SRT). In order to prepare for NAPLAN Online in 2022, all schools transitioning to NAPLAN online are required to conduct the SRT.

The SRT will require all current Year 7 and Year 9 students to sit two separate online NAPLAN tests at the same time. The two tests are a Writing test and an Omnibus Test (contains questions from the Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy).

The SRT is designed to test our network's ability to conduct NAPLAN Online. Student data is **not** collected or reported on as part of this process.

Although the 150th celebration concert has been shifted to February 2022, a sneak peak of how hard the cast and crew have been working is also included in the digital exhibition.



We have included awards this year:




Year 9 Altior English

Culture Makers Lab Webinar - Immigration Museum

Have you ever wondered why people start writing? I didn't really, until I read *The Hate Race* by Maxine Beneba Clarke. It is a memoir full of powerful language, to bring to light how people from minority backgrounds feel marginalised in past and present-day Australia.

After reading the memoir, the Year 9 Altior English classes were invited to attend the Culture Makers Lab webinar run by the Immigration Museum. This webinar explored the complexities of identity and belonging and the ways which people have found and made a living out of writing about their unique lived experiences.




During the webinar we had time to write poetry of our own and to listen to the stories of poets Anthea Yang and Munira Tabassum Ahmed.

I especially liked how the webinar's themes tied in nicely with *The Hate Race*.

A prominent message from both the webinar and memoir, is the idea presented by a quote by Audre Lorde. The quote reads; "If I don't define myself for myself, I would be crunched into other people's fantasies for me and eaten alive."

I believe this quote is beautiful and powerful because it speaks to how you should let people know who you really are. If you don't, it is more likely they will distort your personality until it fits their version of reality.



This was the central theme of the webinar and it is a recurring message within Clarke's memoir. I really enjoyed the opportunity to engage with these ideas and learn from these talented authors.
