From the Assistant Principal - Teaching & Learning

Our VCE students are well into their examination period, with our Year 12 students having sat their English or Literature exams. We understand that this can be a demanding time for both students and parents. When discussing your son's preparation for his exams, prompt him to plan and prioritise areas that need the greatest attention.

Encourage him to maximise revision opportunities in class, review past assessments and feedback, and seek clarification with his teachers. It is also important to remind him that he should be mindful of getting enough sleep, avoiding unnecessary distractions, maintaining physical exercise, and eating well.

Importantly, encourage your son to view his preparation as a learning opportunity to fine-tune strategies that will enable him to manage the challenges that come with preparing for an assessment. Our counselling and wellbeing website on SIMON contains links to resources that may also be of assistance.

2024 JacPLUS - Jacaranda e-Textbook Bundle for Years 8 to 10 in 2024

In 2024, Parade College will continue to use Jacaranda's Digital Bundle as its digital textbook and educational resource provider for students in Years 7 to 10. To ensure that you receive your son's 2024 school year digital textbooks and resources, you are asked to order and pay the fee online via Jacaranda's payment portal by 27 October 2023.

Please note that Year 10 Edmund Rice Pathways Program (ERPP) students at the Preston Campus in 2024 are not required to purchase the Jacaranda Bundle.

Years 8, 9, 10, and 11 Semester Two Examinations

Semester 2 examinations will commence later this month; dates and details are provided below. During the examination period, Year 10 and 11 students are not required to attend school other than for scheduled examinations. The correct summer uniform is required. A supervised revision will be arranged for those attending school. Year 8 and 9 students attend as normal and will have regular timetabled lessons when not involved in an examination.

Examination information and study skills sessions were conducted in the Tutor Group earlier this month, with students having received revision materials to assist in their preparations from their teachers.

Year 10:	31 October to 10 November
Year 8 and 9:	13 to 16 November

Years 10 and 11 Examinations

Year 10 examinations precede a week of Work Experience from 13 to 17 November. Year 11 exams are followed by the compulsory Year 12 2024 Commencement Camp on 15 to 17 November.

2023 Year 11 students are not required to be at school on Monday 13 November and Tuesday 14 November unless they are sitting a Unit 3 and 4 examination on either day. Year 10 2023 students will have work experience during the week commencing Monday 13 November.

2024 Commencement Classes

As the name suggests, all students continuing at Parade in 2024 are required to attend school for commencement classes. The 2024 commencement class begins on Monday 20 November, and ends on Friday 1 December.

It is important to note that teachers will not repeat lessons regarding this information when school returns in 2024. As such, all students must attend.

To support your son's learning during the commencement period, your son's teacher will provide the necessary coursework material. Families will soon receive their son's 2024 subject list and 2024 booklist.

VCAA, VCE, and VET Unit 3 and 4 Written Examinations

VCAA exams commenced on Tuesday 24 October and continue through until Wednesday 15 November. Students have been briefed on rules and procedures and are asked to gather in the exam assembly area 30 minutes prior to the start of their exam.

Neat casual clothes are to be worn, keeping in mind that the temperature inside the Greening Auditorium will be 21 degrees, regardless of how hot or cold the weather outside may be.

A reminder to all Media, Specialist Mathematics, and History: Revolutions students who have their exams on 6 November that there will be no College buses on that day. Students must arrange their own travel to and from the College. The VCE Study Centre will be open from 9.00am and will close at the commencement of the afternoon exam.

Class of 2023 VCAA Results

VCE and VCAL results will be released by VCAA at 7.00am on Monday 11 December. The College will be offering both career counselling and emotional support from Monday 11 December to Wednesday 13 December.

Accelerating Year 11 students will continue to attend their timetabled classes until the date of the respective VCAA examinations. If a student has a Year 11 exam on the same day as their VCAA exam, the Year 11 exam will be rescheduled.

Years 8 and 9 Examinations

Year 8 and Year 9 Semester Examinations begin on Monday 13 November and conclude on Thursday 16 November. Students should refer to the timetable that will be posted on SIMON.

If a student is unable to attend an examination, it will not be possible to have the exam rescheduled. Where a student misses an exam due to an approved absence (e.g., illness), they will receive the grade 'X-Special Circumstance'.

Years 7 to 9 ACER Testing

Students in Years 7 to 9 will complete two ACER tests this Term, one in English, and one in Mathematics. Students do not need to study for these tests. They just need to try their best.

The results of these tests help teachers understand more about each student's progress.
