2025 Commencement Classes

2025 Commencement Classes begin on Monday 25 November until 6 December. All students continuing at Parade in 2025 are required to attend school for these Commencement Classes. It is important to note that teachers will not repeat lessons regarding this information when school returns in 2025.

To support your child's learning during the commencement period, your child's teachers will provide access to the necessary course material if not already available to students. Commencement timetables will be visible on SIMON for students from Saturday 23 November.

When designing the College timetable, our main priority is to cater to student Elective preferences as much as we can while maintaining an even distribution of students across all classes. Other than for compelling cases, no further changes will be possible.

Resource lists for the 2025 Academic Year

Current Year 7 to 11 students should have received their subject allocations for 2025 from their Tutor Teachers. Students involved in ERPP, VCE VM, Sport Academy, and Business Academy follow prescribed courses and will not receive a printed subject list. However, as for all students, they will need the necessary resources listed on the relevant list. Families should ensure that the correct code for each campus is used when ordering. Use the code "XK72" for the Bundoora Campus or "QK GK" for the Preston Campus to access these lists.

VCAA, VCE and VET Unit 3 and 4 Written Examinations

VCAA Exams continue until Wednesday 20 November. Students have been briefed on rules and procedures and are asked to gather in the exam assembly area 20 minutes before the start of their exam.

Students must bring a photo ID to each exam. Neat casual clothes are to be worn, keeping in mind that the temperature inside the Greening Auditorium will be 21 degrees regardless of how hot or cold the weather outside may be.

Year 12 teachers are available to meet with students in their regularly scheduled class times, until the exam day. Students are encouraged to meet with their teachers for feedback and support in the lead-up to these important exams.

VCE and VCE VM results will be released by VCAA on Thursday 12 December. The College will be offering both career counselling and emotional support in the following days. More information was contained in the letter to VCE students.

Years 10 and 11 Post Exam Period

Year 10 Examinations precede a week of Work Experience for Year 10 Bundoora students, beginning on Monday 18 November. Year 11 Exams are followed by the compulsory Year 12 (2025) Commencement Camp on 20 November to 22 November. Year 11 Bundoora (2024) students are not required to be at school on Monday 18 November and

Tuesday 19 November unless they are sitting a Unit 3 and 4 Examination on either day.

Year 12 2024 VCE and VCE VM Day at La Trobe University

All Year 12 students will launch into their 2025 school year with a fantastic opening day at La Trobe University on Thursday 30 January. Guest presenters, past students, and staff from both La Trobe University and Parade will run a day that caters for all students in the Parade Class of 2025.

This is a compulsory event for all Year 12 students with the correct summer school uniform to be worn. Students will need to make their way to La Trobe University (Plenty Rd). We see this as a fantastic way to kick-start this important year of schooling.

Years 8, 9, 10 and 11 Semester 2 Examinations

Semester 2 examinations have commenced for students in Years 10 and 11.

During the examination period, Year 10 and 11 students are not required to attend school other than for scheduled examinations.

A correct summer uniform is required. Study Halls will be available for students who are on-site before or after a scheduled exam.

Year 8 and 9 students will have examinations during Week 7, and they will attend school as normal with regular timetabled lessons when they are not involved in an examination.

If a Year 8 or Year 9 student is unable to attend an examination, it will not be possible to have the exam rescheduled.

Where a student missed an exam due to an approved absence (eg; illness), they will receive the Grade 'X-Special Circumstance' on their report.

They explored key issues, including sustainability and public speaking. During Term 4, the Year 9 student leaders from Parade participated in a four-day conference series via Zoom, focused on leadership. These meetings included other student leaders from schools across Oceania and Asia. It was inspiring to see the Asian students confidently asking and answering questions in English, even though it isn't their primary language.

Throughout these sessions, the students explored the key traits of effective leadership, examined how racial stereotypes can lead to misjudgements, and learned new techniques for speaking to audiences in an engaging way. We shared their ideas through group discussions and interactive Padlet participation.

A major focus was on the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), where students learned about various sustainability

topics and influential figures who have highlighted these issues. The Year 9 leaders collaborated to develop ideas and strategies for promoting sustainability within our school and local community.

Overall, these meetings have provided valuable insights, helping us gain a deeper understanding of what it truly means to be a leader.

SchoolTV Report: Vaping and E-Cigarettes

Over recent years, there has been a growing concern about the impending epidemic affecting young people in relation to the use of e-cigarettes and the trendy pastime of vaping. As this activity grows in popularity, most teenagers are unaware of the associated risks and the potential impact vaping can have on their development and overall health.

Discussions with students revealed students' risk-taking with vapes during Victoria's lockdown and remote learning, and many of these students were unaware of the nicotine content, consequently becoming addicted.

Vaping is the act of inhaling a vapour created by an electronic cigarette, or e-cigarette. Although vaping is often marketed as being the "healthy" alternative to smoking, doctors advise that if you do not smoke, then you should not start vaping. Although vaping products are infused with enticing flavours, many contain high levels of nicotine as well as other chemicals and additives, that when inhaled, can cause severe damage to the lungs.

Australia has strict regulations in place for nicotine-containing products and despite it being illegal to use, sell, or buy nicotine for use in e-cigarettes, users are purchasing these products through other avenues.

A recent Australian study of chemically flavoured liquids used in e-cigarettes which are available here for purchase over the counter, has confirmed concerns about their safety and respiratory health impact. Attempts are being made to regulate vaping and ban the importation of vape products containing nicotine.

Unfortunately, manufacturers are developing vaping devices that are cheaper and easier to hide than conventional cigarettes, making them more attractive and cost-effective for impressionable young people. Please use this link to view a clip on vaping and e-cigarettes.
